LOOKING AT OURSELVES: IMPROVING EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY IN OUR WORKPLACE

We have been obsessed with creating an equal and diverse workforce since we were founded 22 years ago. The data backs this up as we perform favourably in EDI compared to our peers. For example, 58% of our Partners are women, compared with the average of 31% for law firms of our size/standing. Our gender pay gap is currently 0%, with all lawyers being paid an equal hourly rate for their grade, compared with 11.5% average in favour of men elsewhere. 6% of our entire firm is from an ethnic minority group, compared to the national average of 13% (HM Government, 2019 – latest data). 4% of our lawyers are over the age of 55, compared to 8% in other law firms. 66% of our staff attended state-run schools, compared to the national average of 53% and for 76% of staff, neither of their parents attended university, compared to 62% in law firms in the UK (a key indicator for social mobility). We have achieved this by removing the key barriers preventing under-represented groups from succeeding and supporting all staff to achieve their potential.



TRANSFORMING PLACES: LEVELLING-UP AND HABITAT FOR HUMANITY'S EMPTY SPACES TO HOMES COALITION

As an example of our involvement in social value projects, we are working very closely with the charity Habitat for Humanity to help them turn derelict commercial property into high quality homes for the homeless and people living in 'unliveable' conditions (e.g. homes overtaken by mould etc). We are helping them to turn this plan into action on a national scale by sitting on their Coalition Board with a number of other organisations.

OPERATION SUSTAINABILITY: NET-ZERO CARBON TRACKER

DJB is working hard to achieve our net-zero target by 2030. We are one of only a few law firms to hold the ISO14001 Environmental Management accreditation. We have an ESG Taskforce which spends time considering our impact on the environment and ways to further ensure we are effective stewards of the environment. This is then developed into a firmwide policy and actioned. By way of example, we have replaced most of our petrol and diesel cars with electric cars (and will replace the rest soon). We are building a stateof-the-art carbon tracker as well so that we can constantly monitor our levels and identify any potential issues before they become a problem.
